What is the Calderdale Family Journey?



The Calderdale Family Journey is a new web resource for professionals to use with parents and carers to explain the key steps and the ways they can support their child to be ready for reception at school aged four years.

The Family Journey will support parents and carers from pregnancy until their child starts reception at school. It is a guide to learning more about your baby or child's development and knowing who you can contact for advice and support or where you could go to meet other parents.

For professionals, it provides a single point of reference for explaining the steps that families may take as their baby develops into a child that is ready for starting reception at school.

How can you use the Family Journey in your role?



You are the experts: the people working in midwifery, childcare, health visiting, schools, as health professionals, education professionals and in voluntary positions, all of which are directed towards supporting the growth and development of Calderdale children so that they will have the best possible start to life.

This Calderdale Family Journey is a resource designed to help parents and carers but also to help you, when speaking with the families in your care. It is a tool to signpost families on to, to serve as a guide to the steps they can expect on the journey from thinking about having a baby to their child starting reception at school.

Timeline



Phase 1: Launch – November/December 2021

Support the official launch from 4 November by:

- Sharing the web link with parents/carers and professionals/practitioners
- Sharing the press release on your news channels (to be issued post-launch)
- Sharing the link at outreach, community venues and open evenings
- Promoting and discussing the Family Journey at face to face contacts, on websites and within newsletters
- Promoting on your social media pages and re-post on any local parent groups

Phase 2: Embedding – January 2022 onwards

Embed the Family Journey into your practice by:

- Discussing the Family Journey at contacts with families and discussions across services
- Having the link on your organisation's communication channels including websites and social media platforms
- Promoting the Family Journey at key events and open evenings in your setting throughout the year
- Discussing the Family Journey as part of your registration process and including on any service/ activity registrations forms
- Ensure all new staff are made aware of it in briefings, inductions and training

Phase 3: Evaluation – July 2022 onwards

Step 10

The Family Journey has been developed by Calderdale Council's Children and Young People's Services and Public Health, together with partners from Locala, Calderdale and Huddersfield Foundation Trust, Children's Centres, Schools and the Private, Voluntary and Independent Childcare Providers as part of the work of the Starting Well Board.

Starting Well forms a prominent part of the Health and Wellbeing strategy for Calderdale, with the Starting Well theme being a significant stage of the life course, and in many ways the very foundation. What happens in pregnancy and early childhood impacts on physical and emotional health all the way into adulthood. The Starting Well Board, established in September 2020, and chaired jointly by the Director of Education and the Director of Public Health and attended by stakeholders from across the early years system, provides governance and oversight of the Starting Well workstreams and is a driving force to achieve the ambition for every child in Calderdale to have the best start in life.

The Family Journey follows the recommendations set out in the LGA Peer Review Report in February 2020 into Speech, Language and Communication Needs in the Early Years. At a national level, the Family Journey is the initial starting point for addressing certain key action areas from the Dame Andrea Leadsom report the Best Start in Life, particularly ensuring a seamless support offer and providing parents with the information they need when they need it.
